OVERVIEW

This workshop is a deep-dive into the several interactions of the natural and anthropological worlds around water. Through a blend of informative sessions and hands-on activities, attendees gain insights into the ecology and evolution of aquatic life, the development-power sector and water, and human relationships with water ecosystems, with a focus on urban Gujarat. Drawing on scientific and anthropological work, we will highlight how the 'other-than-human' worlds of nature function, and in turn impact human life. The workshop includes a component of speculative design where participants will reimagine life according to different climate scenarios.
